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ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED
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Father's Message:

Dear faithful,
Christ is Risen! Truly He is Risen!

Today, we stand in the light of the greatest and most joyful proclamation ever uttered in human history: "Christ is Risen!" With these words, the darkness of sin and death is shattered. With these words, the tomb becomes the womb of eternal life. And with these words, we are called—not merely to rejoice—but to be transformed.

The Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ is not simply an historical event. It is the foundation of our faith, the victory over death, and the promise of our own resurrection. As St. Paul tells us, "If Christ is not risen, then our preaching is empty and your faith is also empty" (1 Corinthians 15:14). But Christ is risen, and so our faith is full—full of hope, full of power, full of life. What, then, does this mean for us?

First, the Resurrection means that death no longer has the final word. In Christ, death has become a passage—not an end, but a new beginning. As we sing joyfully in the Paschal Canon: "Christ is risen from the dead, trampling down death by death!" In this triumphant act, our Lord entered into the grave not as a victim, but as a conqueror. He destroyed the bonds of Hades and raised up Adam and all his descendants with Him.

Second, the Resurrection is a call to new life. Pascha is not only Christ's victory—it is our participation in that victory. Through baptism, we are buried with Christ and raised with Him into a new life (Romans 6:4). Therefore, we

are no longer slaves to sin, fear, or despair. We are children of the Resurrection. This means our lives must reflect this truth. Our hearts must be resurrected from bitterness, from judgment, from selfishness—raised instead into love, forgiveness, and light.

Third, the Resurrection offers us eternal hope. The world may seem dark. We may face sickness, loneliness, injustice, and loss. But the empty tomb tells us these do not define us. We are destined not for corruption, but for glory. The joy of Pascha reminds us that no matter how deep the night, the dawn will come.

Christ has already won the victory, and we are invited to walk in His triumph.

Finally, my faithful, the Resurrection binds us together in unity. On Pascha night, all divisions fell away. All people—young and old, strong and weak, rich and poor—proclaimed with one voice: "Christ is Risen!" This is not just a greeting; it is a confession of faith and a celebration of our unity in the Risen Lord. In this light, we are called to be a Resurrection people—bringing life where there is death, peace where there is conflict, and hope where there is despair.

So let us go forth, filled with the joy and power of the Resurrection. Let us carry the light of Christ into our homes, into our workplaces, into every corner of the world. Let our lives become icons of the Resurrection, living testimonies that "Christ is Risen!"—and because He is risen, we too shall rise.

EXCERPTS TAKEN FROM "GOD, WHERE IS THE WOUND?" - MOTHER SILUANA

† If I walk with my eyes closed or without paying attention (the act of sinning) and I hit the table, I will feel pain (the sensible part of sin). Pain is not a punishment, it is part of the "mechanism", the process of sin. The table doesn't punish me because I closed my eyes! Neither did God give me the capacity to feel pain (after the fall) to punish me, but to feel my sin and return to Him. This is why we don't need purgatory to atone for our sins, because the moment your sin is forgiven, the punishment disappears. Sin itself is an evil that you do to yourself and that hurts you and wounds you. God lifts this evil from you.

† St. Theoliptus said that everything we did and everything that was done to us gets imprinted in us just like tracks get imprinted in the snow. And just like tracks get erased from the snow by sun and water, so traces in our soul can be erased by the Sun who is Christ, by His burning love, by the *water* of our tears of repentance. The Holy Fathers say that weeping is a path toward the healing of our soul. And don't be afraid if you start by weeping out of spite! We all start the way we can: the important thing is to raise our thoughts to God and His mercy.

**THE JOURNEY OF THE HOLY FIFTY DAYS**

Indeed, the period of the **Fifty Holy Days** is different than the rest of the ecclesiastical calendar. It is unique in that we pray with the festal tune, even in funerals. There is no fasting on Wednesdays and Fridays, and private fasts are not allowed.

However, the Fifty Holy Days have beautiful spiritual depth, which makes a person not lax spiritually, but rather grow and rejoice spiritually after the asceticism of Great Lent and Holy Pascha Week.

It is a period of rejoicing in the Resurrection of our Lord and our resurrection with Him. It is the time to experience the new life in our Lord Jesus Christ. It is the period in which a person, who has practiced self-control over material things during the 55 days of Great Lent, rises to live joyfully in the spirit and worship God in spirit and truth. If a person plants with effort, toil, and tears during Great Lent, then the Fifty Holy Days is the time of harvest, accompanied by joy and gladness.

While Great Lent represents the struggle of the Israelites in the Wilderness of Sinai, the Fifty Holy Days represent the entry of the Israelites into Canaan, the Promised Land. As inspired by the Holy Spirit, the Holy Church arranged so that the readings and hymns of the Fifty Holy Days would help us experience the life of joy and victory of the new life in our Lord Jesus Christ. The person, who spiritually lives the prayers, hymns, and readings of this period, will experience spiritual depth and will benefit. For him, the Fifty Holy Days will no longer be regarded as a time to just eat, drink, and lax spiritually, and thus he will not waste all the beautiful spiritual fruits he collected during Great Lent and Holy Pascha Week. Together, let us meditate on the prayers of the Church, as well as Her hymns, and readings during this blessed period.

The festal tune is used for all the prayers during this time, whether it is the Divine Liturgy, Vespers, the liturgical prayers of the sacraments, and even the funerals. The goal is to make the person feel the joy of the Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. The Divine Liturgy is actually the celebration of Christ's death and resurrection, and even before the Church set a specific day for the celebration of the Feast of the Resurrection, the Divine Liturgy on Sunday morning was and is still considered the weekly celebration of the Resurrection. During the Fifty Holy Days, as we rejoice in the victory of Christ over death, we joyfully sing the Resurrection Hymn, "Christ is Risen": "Christ is risen from the dead. By death He has trampled upon death, and to those in the tombs, He bestowed eternal life."
